**Committee Reports**

*Rescue:* Brenda Hubbard shared the Rescue Report prepared by Edith Bryan. See the report elsewhere in this newsletter.

*Specialty 2014:* The Board approved paying the camping fee at the Specialty for stewards who are not PSLRA members.

—A question came up whether or not there can be exceptions in unusual circumstances to the rule that stud dogs participating in the auction must have all clearances. The Board decided there would be no exceptions. Stud dogs participating will be required to follow the PSLRA Code of Ethics.

*Fall Hunt Test:* Liz Gibson submitted the following report by email:

Reminder to everyone! We have a Hunt test August 23 and 24. Entries close August 11. Otherwise, the plans are coming together, slowly. We need Marshals for all stakes. If people are running dogs and would like to volunteer, please contact Katie Mearns chief Marshal) at

sonkinas.mearns@gmail.com. We need Stake Chairs for Junior and Master. I can send a list of duties. It's not that hard, but

requires some running around and hauling equipment.

*Health Clinic:* MJ Sarbaugh and Nina Mann are working on a flyer. The flyer and information will be in this newsletter.

*Fall WC:* The Fall WC will be held on September 27. The Board discussed the possibility of making some changes to the WC and the location for future WCs.

Options discussed were: changing the location to Pat Murphy's, and Pat Murphy would run the event; hold the 5-Series at the same time as the WC; split off the Training Day from the WC and hold it a couple of weeks before the WC. The Board generally thought the Training Day was important, and that the Training Day combined with the WC, as it is currently and will be this year, is a good way to introduce new members to field events and training. The Board also discussed having a Field Committee to work with the Board to consider if and how we should make any changes to the Club's field events. No decision was made.

*Fall Tracking Test:* The Fall Tracking Test is October 19. Marlys will get update from Lee.

*Holiday Party:* Nina Mann and Bea Ferguson will be Co-chairs. The party will be held at Julie Germano's training facility in Arlington.

**Old Business**

*Facebook Ad:* Jennifer Hajny reported we have had thousands of hits on our Facebook ad. She will evaluate whether to continue after the one-month trial.

*Winger Replacement:* Nancy Harney brought up the need for replacing the wingers. They are OK for this year, but we will probably have to replace them in the next couple of years. The Sand and Sage Club has some good ones that cost \$500 each. Chuck Hilton is going to check with Rainier about the possibility of sharing costs. Nina Mann mentioned she thought we were sharing some wingers with the Evergreen Golden Retriever Club. Nancy will get more specific information for the Board to consider. No decision made.

*LRC Letter to Judges:* LRC sent out a letter published in last month's *Retriever Believer* to all local Labrador clubs. The letter was a follow-up to a previous letter

that was sent to everyone qualified to judge Labradors. Stephanie Harris pointed out the second letter went to a different group of recipients than the first one. The Board decided that PSLRA would contact the LRC Board requesting they send the second letter to the same group of people who received the first one. Jan Palumbo will write a draft request for the PSLRA Board to review before sending a final letter to Nancy Brandow, LRC Secretary.

*Judges Selection Committee:* Linda Maffett provided the list of proposed judges to the Board. Linda is looking for suggestions for Obedience and Rally judges. The Board approved the list of possible judges for 2015 and 2016 as proposed.

#### **New Business**

*Change to Date of Specialty:* Stephanie Harris brought up the possibility of changing the date for the PSLRA

Specialty in future years. She heard the Wenatchee Kennel Club is considering changing their show, which is the second weekend in September, to combining with another club and have a four-day show on another date. If they were to decide to change their date, this would free up the second weekend in September. Stephanie suggested that PSLRA consider the possibility of moving our Specialty to that weekend. She would like us to discuss it now and make a decision so that in the event the weekend opens up, we will be poised to jump on that date if we so decide. Stephanie said that Katie Somers is also a member of the Wenatchee club, and Stephanie will explore with her what the Wenatchee club is planning. The Board discussed some pros and cons of changing the date for our Specialty. No decision was made.

*Old Match Trailer:* Shelah Frey is storing the old match trailer. She asked what we are planning to do with it, and if we are going to sell it. Shelah agreed to store it for a couple more months.

Kimberly will contact the president of RHRC and find out if they want share the trailer and costs involved and equipment. If so, a contract will be drawn up. Several people have expressed interest in buying it. The Board will decide next month.



SUNDAY, SEPTEMBER 28, 2014



By pre-reservation only-closes when limits are reached or September 17 - whichever is first :

Eye clinic-absolute limit of 100 dogs.

All other tests - no limit

Payment of all fees is required in advance before reservations are confirmed.

A \$5.00 fee will be charged for canceling after paperwork is completed—NO refunds on day of clinic.

REMEMBER: You MUST enclose a copy of each dog's registration papers or litter registration —AND type your entry form!!!!

Eye clinic will be performed by Dr. Sullivan, ACVO, of Animal Eye Clinic of Seattle and is for genetic screening only.

Do not bring dogs with eye injuries or other conditions requiring treatment.

Heart Screening will be performed by Dr. Woodfield, ACVIM (cardiology) of Northwest Cardiology Consultants.

In consideration of confidentiality, please refrain from announcing screen results, either positive or negative while at this clinic.

EIC and CNM swabs and identification verification will be done by veterinarians who have donated their time.


## Monaco

Brendan and Sheila wanted me to tell everyone that Bella has made their home a very happy and loving place.—Jan Palumbo





## 2014 PSLRA Health Clinic

First of all, be sure you know the date! - September 28. The calendar in your membership book says September 21 and that has been changed to September 28. Don't come on the wrong weekend. Elsewhere in this newsletter is the flier for the Health Clinic. Again this year everything can be done with cheek swabs - no more blood draws!

**EYES: ACVO/OFA.** Dr. Sullivan will be coming as always and performing his scheduling miracles to get through 100 dogs in one day. To help with this, we do restrict the eye exams to Labradors except for club members who have other breeds they would like checked. We also will only accept litters of puppies if there is room at closing. You can notify us if you have a litter you want checked, but no guarantees that there will be room. Fee on flier.

**HEARTS:** Dr. Woodfield will be performing his heart exams in a quiet room away from the main examining room. Please be as quiet as possible outside this room. This year he is again doing both auscultation and ECHO examinations. There will be forms available to register your dogs with OFA, or you can go to the OFA site and preprint your form for his signature. **Please**, there will not be time for extended consultations - - those will need to be scheduled at his private clinic in Lynnwood.

**CNM-Centronuclear Myopathy:** CNM in Labrador Retrievers is a recessively inherited muscular disease, a disease previously known as Labrador muscular myopathy. The condition is characterized by early onset muscular problems such as awkward gait and difficulty eating. Affected puppies begin displaying these problems within a few months after birth. The test offered here is based on the mutation discovered in France at the Alfort School of Veterinary Medicine. As with other recessive diseases, animals with two copies of the mutation will be affected and display symptoms, animals with one copy (carriers) and no copies (clear) will not. Email Mary Jane for further question She will be filling out the CNM forms. More information about CNM can be found at [www.labradorcnm.com](http://www.labradorcnm.com).

**EIC: Exercise induced collapse.** Signs usually first become apparent in young dogs - somewhere between 5 months and 3 years of age. Littermates and other related dogs are commonly affected but depending on their lifestyle they may never manifest symptoms. Affected dogs exhibiting symptoms of collapse are usually described as being fit, muscular, athletic specimens of their breed with lots of drive. Some of the dogs appear to be uncoordinated. Some dogs appear to have a loss of balance and may fall over. Please visit the EIC site and preprint and fill out the form. Put your email address in the results area and fill in your OWN vet's name and address so they get results instead of having them sent to the clinic vet. The University of Minnesota research indicates that only 8 percent of Labradors tested are affected so this is a condition that can be easily eliminated by testing. <http://www.vdl.umn.edu/servicesandfees>.

**DD Locus:** Say no to silvers who carry this gene! New this year is testing for the dilute gene. The D locus is the primary locus associated with diluted pigment. The identified coat color genes in the Labrador include: A, B, C, E but not D. The omission of "d," and thus the impossibility of a dd dilute gene resulting from a pure Labrador breeding, is persuasive evidence that the silver Labrador is not a purebred. Both Vet Gen and DDC offer tests for this gene and are offering us discounts at the clinic. OFA is hosting a data base of dogs proven not to carry it. Please test as many dogs as you can afford and help say NO to Silvers! European breeders will be looking at the OFA data base. They are alarmed to find they are bringing puppies over from the US that have identifiable silvers in their pedigrees. We are hoping that eventually all breeders will be able to post on their web sites that all their dogs are tested free of the dilute.

**MICROCHIP:** The club has Trovan ISO microchips if your dog has not already been microchipped. These chips have a prepaid lifetime enrollment with AKC/CAR. You just need to fill in the paperwork. We will mail them in for you. Fee includes chip and lifetime enrollment.

You need only send the latest AKC certificate. For example, if you have an AKC championship, an AKC CD, and you get an AKC JH - that last certificate will have the other titles included so only send one piece of paper. If you have an International championship, I know you probably won't have your title certificate as that takes about eight months or longer to come from Germany. Your cards from the shows are perfectly acceptable.

While you are on our web site printing out the application, take time to look at the list of previous award winners. We are a very accomplished club!

**LIST OF LITTERS BORN OR EXPECTED AS OF 7/29/2014 that conform to the P.S.L.R.A. Code of Ethics.**

Information is as submitted by owners and provided as a service to the public. Listings of litters are in no way an endorsement by P.S.L.R.A. of any litter or any one litter over another. Litters are removed from the list after 12 weeks.

To publish **LITTER LISTINGS** in the newsletter, the following information **must be available**:

- \* Elbows and hips must be certified on both the sire and dam. Dogs and bitches whelped before 5/1/87 are exempt from elbow clearance requirements and will be marked OFEL N/A. Prelims are not acceptable! The board has agreed to accept PennHip clearances that score in the 50th percentile or higher, and clearances from the Ontario Veterinary College (OVC) in Canada prior to May 2012. Bitches with a Penn Hip, or OVC clearance must not be bred before the age of 20 months, or 24 months with an OFA clearance. Dogs with a Penn Hip clearance must not be bred before the age of 12 months, 18 months with an OVC clearance, 24 months with an OFA clearance.
  - \* Eye clearances on both parents annually.
  - \* Heart, EIC, PRA and CNM clearances will be included in the listing at the discretion of the breeder
  - \* A PSLRA member must own either the sire or the dam and must submit the listing for a non-member.
  - \* Please use the PSLRA Breeder Litter Listing Program format below for ALL litters.
  - \* All Breeders must update their litters each week with Nina Mann via email ([harbortop@netzero.net](mailto:harbortop@netzero.net)) as to the sex and color of puppies you have available. The listing will be deleted after 12 weeks from the first litter listing date.
1. Mail the completed form and a check (US funds only) for \$10 (operating expenses for Breeder Listing and Puppy Referral Programs) or email your PayPal receipt to: Nina Mann, 5706 312th St. NW, Stanwood, WA 98292-9649.
  2. Your litter notice will appear in the next PSLRA newsletter if it conforms to the Code of Ethics.


