

Important PSLRA Health Clinic & Health Clearance Information!

Elsewhere in this newsletter is the flier for our annual Health Clinic, which increases in scope every year. The big news this year is that everything can be done with cheek swabs - *no more blood draws!*

EYES: ACVO/CERF:

Dr. Sullivan will be coming as always and performing his scheduling miracles to get through 100 dogs in one day. To help with this, we do restrict the eye exams to Labradors except for club members who have other breeds they would like checked. We also will only accept litters of puppies if there is room at closing. You can notify us if you have a litter you want checked, but no guarantees that there will be room.

Fee for each dog \$16.

OPTIGEN:

Once again, we will offer a 20/20 clinic which means that if 20 dogs participate, each will get a 25% discount. It also means that if you sign up we will count on you to help make up the numbers. Any "no shows" will penalize everyone else as the discount is only offered if there are 20 dogs. Sign up on line, at http://www.optigen.com/opt9_request.html using the discount code that Nina Mann will give you TWO WEEKS before the clinic. It is not available earlier.

Fee is paid online through [Optigen](#).

New this year is the RD/OSD test being offered at [Optigen](#). RD in Labradors can be an indication that the dog is a carrier of a serious inherited syndrome called OSD (OculoSkeletalDysplasia). OSD is a severe condition in which the dogs show a variety of skeletal malformations including: shortened limbs (dwarfism), and blindness at an early age; the blindness results from a generalized malformation of the retina that causes a partial or full retinal detachment and cataracts. The retinal folds seen at a 7-week eye exam can be a symptom of this.

HEARTS:

Dr. Woodfield will be performing his heart exams in a quiet room away from the main examining room. Please be as quiet as possible outside this room. He does auscultation only and there are forms available to register your dogs with OFA as cleared by a cardiologist, or you can go to the OFA site and preprint your form for his signature. Fee \$30

CNM-Centronuclear Myopathy:

CNM in Labrador Retrievers is a recessively inherited muscular disease, a disease previously known as Labrador muscular myopathy. The condition is characterized by early onset muscular problems such as awkward gait, fatigue, and difficulty eating. Affected puppies generally begin displaying these problems within a few months after birth. Researchers in France, Drs. Tiret and Blot at The Alfort School of Veterinary Medicine discovered the mutation that is responsible for the disease. The test offered here is based on this discovery. As with other recessive diseases, animals with two copies of the mutation will be affected and display symptoms, whereas animals with one copy (carriers) and no copies (clear) will be symptom free.

Fee \$60. Send Mary Jane your check, she prefers to fill out these forms herself.

EIC Exercise Induced Collapse:

Signs first become apparent in young dogs - usually between 5 months and 3 years of age. Littermates and other related dogs are commonly affected but depending on their temperament and lifestyle they may or may not manifest symptoms. Affected dogs exhibiting symptoms of collapse are usually described as being extremely fit, muscular, prime athletic specimens of their breed with an excitable temperament and lots of drive. Some of the dogs appear to be uncoordinated. Some dogs appear to have a loss of balance and may fall over, particularly as they recover from complete collapse.

If you wish the results sent to your own veterinarian, please visit the [EIC website](#) and preprint and fill out the form. Add your email address if you wish to have the results emailed to you, but Vet Med notifies through veterinarians and if you do not fill out your own vet's name and address, the results will be sent to the club member veterinarian who is volunteering to help at the clinic. In order to post your results at OFA your dog's microchip must be verified by a veterinarian. Forms can be found at <http://www.cvm.umn.edu/vdl/ourservices/canineneuromuscular/taylor2008/home.html>

MICROCHIP:

The club has a few fully paid Trovan microchips if your dog has not already been microchipped. These chips have a prepaid enrollment with AKC/CAR and just need to have the paperwork mailed in. Fee for chip and enrollment \$20.

DNA RESEARCH:

Add \$1 per dog to your check and help fund research into all Labrador health problems.. The CHIC DNA, co-sponsored by the OFA and the AKC Canine Health Foundation collects and stores canine DNA samples along with corresponding pedigree and phenotype information to facilitate future research and testing aimed at reducing the incidence of inherited disease in dogs. Researchers in need of specific kinds of DNA only have to call OFA to be sent whatever suitable DNA samples they have on hand. The Golden Retrievers have over 3,000 samples stored with OFA and the Labradors have only 300. We're challenging

PSLRA to add 50 dogs to the data base at this clinic. There is a short health survey to fill out, everything is completely confidential and four cheek swabs will go in to OFA to be stored for future use in discovering the genetic causes of hereditary conditions. \$1 per dog is a very small donation to make for so much result.

Payment of all fees is required in advance before reservations are confirmed.

A \$5.00 fee will be charged for canceling after paperwork is completed---NO refunds on day of clinic.

REMEMBER: You MUST enclose a copy of each dog's registration papers or litter registration ---OR type your entry form!!!!

- Eye clinic will be performed by Dr. Sullivan, ACVO, of Animal Eye Clinic of Seattle and is for genetic screening only.
Do not bring dogs with eye injuries or other conditions requiring treatment.
In consideration of confidentiality, please refrain from announcing eye screen results, either positive or negative while at this clinic.
Heart Screening will be performed by Dr. Woodfield, ACVIM (cardiology) of Northwest Cardiology Consultants.
EIC and CNM swabs and identification verification will be done by veterinarians who have donated their time.

Information is as submitted by owners and provided as a service to the public. Listings of litters are in no way an endorsement by P.S.L.R.A. of any litter or any one litter over another. Litters are removed from the list after 3 mos. To publish **LITTER LISTINGS** in the newsletter, the following information **must be available**:

- Elbows and hips must be certified on both the sire and dam. Dogs and bitches whelped before 5/1/87 are exempt from elbow clearance requirements and will be marked OFEL N/A. Prelims are not acceptable! The board has recently agreed to accept PennHip clearances that score in the 50th percentile or higher, passing Wind-Morgan clearances, and clearances from the Ontario Veterinary College (OVC) in Canada. Female Labradors (bitches) with a Wind-Morgan, Penn Hip, or OVC clearance must not be bred before the age of 20 months, or 24 months with an OFA clearance. Male Labradors (dogs) with a Wind-Morgan, Penn Hip or OVC clearance must not be bred before the age of 12 months, or 24 months with an OFA clearance.
 - Eye clearances on both parents annually. After the dog's examination at age 10, annual examinations are no longer necessary.
 - Heart clearances will be included in the listing at the discretion of the breeder
 - A PSLRA member must own either the sire or the dam and must submit the listing for a non-member.
 - **Please contact Jessica if you need a Litter Listing form, to be used for ALL litters.**
 - All Breeders must update their litters each week with Jessica Meadows via email (labradays@aol.com) as to the sex and color of puppies you have sold. The listing will be deleted after 3 months from the first litter listing date unless she hears from you.
1. Mail the completed form and a check for \$10 made out to PSLRA (operating expenses for Breeder Listing and Puppy Referral Programs) to **Jessica Meadows, 8108 Abbey Pl, Arlington WA 98223**
 2. Your litter notice will appear in the next PSLRA newsletter **if** it conforms to the Code of Ethics.
