# Club Business

## Board of Directors' Meeting Minutes - May 17, 2017

The meeting was conducted via teleconference. Board members present included the following: Stephanie Harris, Shelah Frey, Kristen Reiter, Linda Maffett, Becky and Scott Dannaker, Sonya Dudder, Brenda Hubbard, Nina Mann, Diane Sullenberger, Katie Somers, Marlys Swanson, and Ramdas Vaidyanathan, Marcy Johnson, and Field Chairpersons Jim and Cindy Olson. There were no reports from any of the officers.

Stephanie would like to ensure the Hunt Test volunteers are acknowledged. Cindy will contact Liz Gibson for a list of names and submit to Kristen for recognition in the newsletter. The Field Test went well. There is still enough ammunition to conduct the Fall Test as well as the WC. Scott came to the test and acquainted himself with the trailer and equipment. The biggest issue that hindered the test was that the Pepper's had not mowed the fields. Rainier had to pay an individual to mow some sections. Participants were complaining that the grasses were so long the dogs couldn't locate the birds. There are no plans to limit entries for the Hunt Test in August. The Master National will be held in Oregon next year and the season for qualifying begins August 1st. As a result, we will be expecting approximately one hundred Master dogs and should see a greater profit.

The WC is going to be held in September, with an expected attendance of fifty to sixty dogs. There will be field day training run prior to the tests, so organizers must double the amount of ammunition

expected for the event. In addition, birds are at a premium currently due to extensive losses to avian flu. Cindy suggested that the WC chairs start to source birds now. Marlys will email Cindy for contact information on bird availability.

Brenda did not have a rescue report at the time of the meeting but Edith will submit a report to print in the newsletter.

The membership book has been sent for review and printing and will be ready for distribution in the next day or so. Brenda needs address labels and stamps to complete the task and is awaiting a check from Jill to pay the printer. Stephanie will communicate with Brenda offline regarding the status of payment.

Marlys provided the match update. It will be held on June 17th, with four

judges who have all been secured. Cathy Hakola is handling the prizes. The budget has been delayed and will be presented online for approval. The grounds are reserved and confirmed and the AKC communications are in hand. Stephanie cannot attend the meeting, in her absence, Shelah will conduct business. Marlys would like to encourage all members to pre-enter to aid in planning and organization. Participants pay on the day of the show and there will be no charges if you don't attend, even if you signed up.

There were no updates for agility. There was some discussion on the provision of lunch, but it was determined that lunches had been handled. Ram offered to provide assistance if it is still needed.

Linda reported on the specialty. The premium is nearly completed, prizes are done, and everything appears to be on schedule. Angela Rogalla is working on the budget but is waiting on information from Jill prior to submitting.

There was no update on the Health Clinic.

Marlys reported on the Field Day and Working Certificate testing. Greenleaf's has been confirmed, but the property sold and will change ownership in July. It is believed that Jerry Leach, the new owner is on board with the use of the property, but it was suggested that Marlys confirm this. (continued...)

# Meeting Minutes, con't

Nina reported on the Fall Tracking Test. She is awaiting a check from Jill to secure the grounds. There will be slots for six TDs and two TDXs, with a preference in testing provided to Labradors.

Becky reported on the holiday party. There are still supplies left over from last year. As the party is still a long way off, she requested no further discussion until the date approaches.

The topics moved on to old business. The Tri-County Trailer agreement is still pending. Jim will work on getting an update.

Marcy and Shelah presented an update on the Handler Auction to benefit the Junior members' scholarship fund. There has been a great response from the handlers. The committee will create an explanation of the fundraiser and list on social media so interested parties can contribute and bid. They intend on including photographs, summaries and what exactly each handler is willing to donate.

Marlys stated that the club has \$500 in scholarship money to be awarded to juniors who are club members. She will send a summary of the scholarship available to be published in the June newsletter.

Shelah inquired about hosting a junior supported entry. To keep it simple, it would not be breed restricted. She offered a suggestion to consider supporting an all-breed show in Canada. Stephanie countered with concerns of what the AKC would have to say if we supported a CKC show. One of the rules state that our club board members must be US citizens, it seems unlikely that they would approve our support of a show that is out of the country. If this idea is to be pursued, we have to be sure it is not in conflict with the AKC. Marcy and Shelah will look into other shows where we might be able to offer a junior supported entry. Jen Snyder and Katie are coordinating the supported entry for Wenatchee. Shelah will be in touch with them and see if the juniors can still be added. Katie believes it is likely too late but will check and inform Shelah. If it is too late for Wenatchee, then it was suggested to pursue Puyallup as it has a bigger entry. Shelah made a motion to add Best Junior Handler to the supported entry for an award totaling a \$50 value. Sonya seconded the motion and all were in favor. Stephanie suggested that every Junior handler who shows a Labrador receive a certificate for a free gift (ie a coupon for a free scone). That way all of the Juniors exhibiting Labradors will be recognized. Stephanie was approached by a member who is interested in providing assistance with our website. She will follow up with this member for further details. Marlys knows of a club member who suggested a specific webmaster. She will follow up with this individual and try to have more information next month.

The AKC has sent out information on a poster containing the Code of Ethics. It was asked if we should display this poster at any of our events. The poster does not seem appropriate material for the sportmen's show or Seattle Kennel Club educational booths. It was suggested that members review the materials available from the AKC to see if there are any publications that we could print out to aid in education.

Linda reported that the Breeders' List has been sent to Jill for invoicing.

Marlys inquired as to whether the club has donated any funds to research yet this year. Stephanie explained these donations are usually submitted at the end of the year. This can be verified by Jill. Marlys suggested we consider funding research on copper toxicosis. Another suggestion was the TVD study. We could invite one of the researchers to give a small talk on the disease and research project, or they could be welcomed to write up a brief summary for our newsletter.

Brenda inquired if anyone has access to a credit card number in order to pay for the printing of the member directories if Jill is not available to cover the costs. Stephanie advised her that Jill should be able to call in the card number if it isn't possible to pay in person.

Ram inquired as to the requirements listed for posting a litter for sale online and in our newsletter as it states that dogs prior to 1987 are exempt from some genetic screening. The concern was that this rule appears outdated as dogs from 1987 and previous have most certainly passed away. Stephanie explained that since we occasionally utilize frozen semen, this rule is actually still valid.

Shelah suggested a first aid triage class or presentation at one of our membership meetings. An added bonus would be if the speaker would be willing to assemble and dispense first aid kits that could address ailments and injuries when a veterinarian isn't immediately available. Shelah will take photographs of her kit to provide some ideas.

Jim put out a request for help for the Fall Hunt Test. Kris will be sure to have an announcement in the upcoming newsletters.

# Rescue Report


## Jeeves

About six years ago, our rescue was contacted about finding a new home for Jeeves, a black male Labrador Retriever who had had some service dog training in his past. Because of his service experience, we matched Jeeves with a family whose son had some special needs. Jeeves accepted his new responsibility with enthusiasm, and had soon attached himself firmly to his new boy. He even accompanied his new friend during a stay of several days at Swedish Hospital, not long after joining the family. His new mom wrote:



‘Jeeves, aka “Jeep” and “Mr. Jeepers,” was adored by a hundred or more kids with autism who have come through our doors to visit along with their parents. He’s gone trick-or-treating in costume with my son, and we’ve never missed a Chipotle free BooRito event—he went in costume every year with our family.’ When their son’s health improved, Jeeves decided on his own that his new mom needed him more, and glued himself to her side.

“I was honored to have such a devoted partner,” she told us. “Jeeves loved accompanying me everywhere, and was a loyal helper when I was tending to the chickens and gardens. He always came to sunbathe next to me when I worked in the garden. When his new dad and I got married, we had a special bandana made for him to match our wedding clothes so he could be the best man! Jeeves knew “yes” and “no” commands, and would actually shake his head emphatically up and down for YES when you asked if he wanted something. He would turn his head to the side for “no.” He was apparently trained to stay by your side when you were sweeping, mopping or showering—and he took his job very seriously. Jeeves loved every human and animal that he met, and was good friends with the small dog in the family.

Sadly, Jeeves developed an aggressive cancer this spring, which did not respond to any treatment. With the help of their kind veterinarian, Jeeves passed away peacefully at home with his family at his side, and is buried in the back yard. Jeeves was appreciated and adored by all of his family for six amazing years, and we are so grateful to them for giving Jeeves such a wonderful second home

These judges watch several hundred to thousand dogs work during the year and to receive this pronounced placement in all the searches was a rare and treasured honor. 

I know, I know! This is NOT a Labrador brag...but it is the reason for the delay in completing this newsletter and I'm too stoked about it to not share. On May 18th, a group of trail riders (all members of the John Wayne Pioneer Wagons and Riders club) gathered in Easton, WA. Over the next eighteen days, we rode or drove our horses (some members bicycled) 223 miles to the town of Tekoa. It is the goal of the club to raise awareness for the John Wayne Trail and prevent the government from closing access to this great treasure. The ride has challenged my horsemanship, bravery (I'm afraid of heights and the trail is jam-packed with high trestles to cross...one WITHOUT sides!!!), physical endurance and determination, but it has also exposed me to the heartwarming feeling of community and the incredible strength of human spirit. I was moved by the generosity of those who had virtually nothing and the kind words and support from strangers. The intimate one-on-one time I've had to share with my horse with minimal interruption from daily life and responsibilities has helped our partnership thrive. Trail riding is still relatively new to him as he'd spent the first seven years of his life in the show pen, protected by four walls and minimal outside stimulation. Having crop dusters circle over his head, semi trucks honking under the bridges he's crossing, birds flying out of the brush in front of him, pitch black train tunnels to ride through and too many other obstacles and experiences to mention, has been invaluable in helping him to become a trustworthy trail mount. - ◆ Heart and other clearances will be included in the listing at the discretion of the breeder.
- ◆ A PSLRA member must own either the sire or the dam and must submit the listing for a non-member.

**Please obtain a Litter Listing form from the PSLRA web site, to be used for ALL litters.** All Breeders must update their litters each week with Nina Mann via email (harbortoplabs@gmail.com) as to the sex and color of puppies you have available. The listing will be deleted after 12 weeks from the first litter listing date.

2. Your litter notice will appear on the web site and in the next PSLRA newsletter if it conforms to the Code of Ethics.
3. If you know that the Litter Listing and the Puppy Referral programs have helped you sell your puppies, please send a donation to PSLRA (c/o Jill Mahoney, treasurer) to show your appreciation.
