On the first weekend of May, hunt test season begins locally. Our AKC hunting retriever test will be held at Pepper's Farm near Carnation on May 2 and 3. The test involves all levels of performance: Master Hunter (Saturday and Sunday), Senior Hunter (Saturday), and Junior Hunter (Sunday).

We have many jobs to fill, and we try to keep the shifts as short as possible. If you cannot volunteer, you should still come out and watch the event. It is a great opportunity to see some great work by our dogs and their handlers. This is a true performance event where the dogs must accomplish several retrieving and other tasks.

Also due to the bird flu, the club is looking for an individual to travel on Thursday prior to the test to pick up birds from the bird supplier in Caldwell, Idaho Friday a.m. and deliver the birds back to Pepper's on Friday evening. February Tracking Test: All full with eight on waiting list.

PSLRA Field Day: March 28. Please watch for more information regarding this event. Contact Fran Seagren so she knows how many entries to expect, and/or if you would like to volunteer to help. Many more volunteers are needed to make this a successful event. The flyer is being updated and information regarding this will be in March newsletter and sent to members directly instead of using the LabChat.

SKC Booth and Meet the Breed: Our Chairmen for this event (Marlys, Shelah and Tamaria) will be looking for volunteers to help with both of these.

Watch the Yahoo chat group for opportunities to help.

Spring WC: Due to the bird flu, there is not a way to get birds for the Spring WC. Shelah motioned to cancel the spring WC. Nina seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.

Spring Hunt Test: Kim went to meeting with Chuck Hilton, Liz Gibson, Jerry Leitch, Jim Olson, Cindy Olson, and Chris Dotson regarding the bird situation for the upcoming hunt test events. The club has to buy (splitting three ways with other clubs) 35 bird crates and go to Idaho to pick up birds. A volunteer is needed to go over on Thursday two days before the test and pick up the birds in Idaho on Friday a.m., and bring the birds directly to Pepper's.

The club will pay for the following: one night in a motel, meals, gas and will pay \$100.00 per day for their time. Crates will have to be sanitized before going back to get the second shipment of birds. There will be information in the newsletter regarding this issue, looking for volunteers, and explaining the entry price increase. Entry fees will be increased to the following for 2015: Masters - \$85.00, Senior - \$75.00, and Juniors - \$70.00. Need many more volunteers. Expense for crates will be included in the hunt test budget.

Spring Agility Trial: The location will be changing to Mt. Vernon.

Fun Match: Need judges. Marlys will move forward with this, as well as procuring the regular site in Renton.

Specialty: Jill sent paperwork to AKC. We are waiting for approval from AKC. All judges have accepted assignment. Jill is still looking for a Juniors judge to complete the panel.

March 28, 9 a.m. - 3:30 p.m.
Greenleaf's Property, Monroe, Washington

FIELD DAY INFORMATION:

- **Beginner** dogs and puppies – no cost
- **Junior** and **Senior** dogs - \$10 a dog (to cover bird and ammo costs)
- **Pre-Registration deadline March 21.** Limit 30 dogs per stake.
- Training devices may be used in all stakes. (long or short leads, heeling sticks, e-collars, etc.).
- Check in when you arrive at 9 a.m.

Beginner Stake and brief educational offerings with Q&A starts at 9:30.

Beginner Stake is for handlers with puppies (over 4 months) and dogs NEW to retrieving. This stake is for puppies or dogs that have not retrieved birds and are new to field work. This is also the ideal place for you to enter your puppy or dog if you are aiming to earn a Working Certificate later this year. We recommend starting with the educational offerings - the field work will begin after the educational sessions are over:

- Basics of field work and obedience
- Popper gun management
- How to work a winger

The Beginner Stake goal is to excite your dog, work on retrieving a bird at short distances, familiarize them with dead birds, duck calls, pistol shots. **If you are not sure where to start, this is the place. Bring a long line or lead.** There will be NO LIVE PIGEONS at the Beginner Stake.

Junior Stake is for dogs that have retrieved birds before - meaning they will go out, pick up a bird *and bring it back*. Starting with distances of 25-50 yards, single marks, flat cover. There will be a single holding blind before the line. You'll be retrieving live shot pigeons and dead birds at this stake.

Senior Stake is for dogs that have had more training, double marks, a blind or two and distances up to 100 yards with possible obstacles and cover. Dogs will be allowed to honor on lead. There will be multiple holding blinds before the line. You'll be retrieving live shot pigeons and dead birds at this stake.

ATTN: As this is designed to be a "training day," we need participants to help as you would at a regular training day with a group. Meaning, we need people to take turns at the pop and throw stations as well as help in other areas. Don't worry if you've never done it before, there will be experienced people to instruct as well as help and run their dogs. We want this to be a great training day for everyone whether this is your first time or not.

Let's get tracking

PSLRA held its second Variable Surface Tracking and Tracking Dog Urban tests on February 22. Workers, entrants and spectators enjoyed the unseasonably warm and splendid weather.

We had a full test. Four Labradors were entered in the TDU and three entries in the VST (Harrier, Belgian Sheepdog, and Longhaired Dachshund). We had several alternate entries on the TDU wait list. One of those dogs, an English Springer Spaniel, got to run an official track, thanks to the judges laying an alternate track.

On the second track of the day, Kathleen Ball and Butter, Brigadoon's Princess Bride, CDX, TDX, became our only passing team of the day. Butter can now add the TDU title to her name.

Jan Skewes earned the Stinky Feet award for being Butter's tracklayer. Several of the other teams came close, but had challenges they couldn't overcome on that day. I always wish for more passes. These two tests are difficult and especially the VST.

Unforeseen and unpredictable challenges the dogs faced included: many tempting feral bunnies; a spectator with a not-friendly Boxer parked on the last leg of one of the TDU tracks; a worker with a leaf blower next to the second leg of one of the VST tracks; several Frisbee games going on across the start of one track; plus many, many (fortunately on leash) dogs, little kids, and accompanying adults out enjoying the incredible weather. Two of the articles on one of the VST tracks had been moved and placed on nearby picnic tables. (Someone trying to be helpful?)

Tracking tests take many workers to be successful, most of whom commit to two full days of preparation and putting on the test. I would like to thank everyone who helped make these tests successful!

A special thanks goes to Jan Palumbo for taking on the secretary responsibilities. This was a new job for her. Thanks to Jan Skewes for getting the judges' gifts and track laying, Kaari White and Liz O'Callaghan for first time tracklayers, Darlene Pado for coming back to tracklaying and for taking photos, Michelle Brown for driving the TDU tracklayers and general leading skills, Lucy Isaacson-Logan for stepping in and driving plus bringing lunch and coffee, Nina Mann for general everything – track laying, bringing breakfast, snacks and beverages. Fred Drennan and Terry Massagli for tracklaying and creating yet another incredible brunch, plus a bunch of the paperwork! And, of course, our wonderful judges, Sil Sanders (Stanwood) and Meg Azevedo (Sacramento area) for putting in very nice tracks and being great to work with all weekend. You all were awesome!

PSLRA puts on two weekends of tracking tests per year, the VST/TDU in February and the TD/TDX in October. Please join us for fresh air, camaraderie and wonderful dog work.—Franna Pitt, 2015 VST/TDU Chairman



PUGET SOUND LABRADOR RETRIEVER ASSOCIATION

CODE OF ETHICS

The Puget Sound Labrador Retriever Association, recognizing our responsibility to the Labrador Retriever and the retriever breed enthusiast, sets forth this Code of Ethics, to reflect the desire of the membership to:

- ◆ Keep the Labrador Retriever sound, healthy and free of hereditary diseases.
- ◆ Maintain the working ability of the Labrador Retriever.
- ◆ Conform to the American Kennel Club's published Standard of the Breed.
- ◆ Be honest in the evaluation of animals used for breeding and/or offered for sale.
- ◆ Exercise truth in advertising.

As an aid to evaluating the suitability of stud dogs and brood bitches, we recommend that members only use stud dogs and brood bitches that have met the following criteria:

- ◆ Labrador Retrievers are registered with the AKC or a recognized foreign registry.
- ◆ Eyes are examined within 12 months of breeding by a board certified Ophthalmologist (ACVO) and found free of hereditary eye disease. These results may be submitted to CERF or OFA. After the dog is age 10, annual examinations are no longer necessary.
In the event frozen semen is used to produce a litter, the dog whose semen is used is required to have a current eye clearance. If, however, that dog is dead, the last clearance within 12 months of the dog's death or a clearance at age 10 will be accepted.
- ◆ At least one of the breeding pair be DNA tested clear or certified clear by parentage of PRA-prcd
- ◆ Hips are certified to be fair, good or excellent AND elbows are certified to be normal by at least one of the following methods:
 - Certification by the Orthopedic Foundation for Animals (OFA) for dogs/bitches 24 months of age or older.
 - A PennHip score in the 50th percentile or higher for dogs/bitches 12 months of age or older. Note: PennHip does not certify elbows
 - Certification by the Ontario Veterinary College (OVC) prior to May 2012
 - A Wind-Morgan report certifying that dogs/bitches are free of degenerative joint disease; applies only to frozen semen from male dogs deceased
- ◆ Are of sound temperament and free from disqualifications as described in the breed standard.
- ◆ Failure to actively help in rehoming a dog placed in our rescue program and produced by a club member will result in banning the use of the litter list and/or being on the breeder's list.

Members should guarantee the general health of their puppies at time of sale.

Only those stud dogs, bitches or puppies who have met the above requirements and have certification may be featured at any PSLRA function that endorses said dogs.

Only those litters whose sire and dam have met the above requirements and dam is owned by a member in good standing of PSLRA will be allowed to advertise in the Club's newsletter or be listed with the PSLRA Litter List.

Non members may list only one litter and only if a PSLRA member owns either the stud dog or dam and both meet the above COE. After that they must become a member of PSLRA to list any litters.

Club members do not need to be on the Breeder's List to list a litter and may list as many as they want that meet the COE; however, if they list more than 2 litters a year, they DO need to meet the Breeder's List volunteer requirement..

Listings will be for 12 weeks only with no renewals. After twelve weeks the older puppies may be listed in the "older dogs being placed" category.

When listing a litter fees and or proof of payment through PAYPAL must accompany all health certifications of the sire and dam.

The fee to list a litter is \$25 plus a donation to PSLRA Rescue Fund after puppies are sold.

- ◆ Further, PSLRA urges all members to adopt a spay/neuter program, to sell companion animals on a limited registration, and to take back any dogs of any age if buyers can no longer keep them for any reason.
- ◆ A member should not supply puppies for auction or for resale to pet stores, laboratories or other wholesale outlets, in accordance with AKC guidelines.

In addition to the above PSLRA recommends that breeding dogs and bitches :

- ◆ Be examined by a licensed Veterinary Cardiologist and found clear of Tricuspid Valve Disease (TVD) by Echocardiogram
- ◆ At least one of the breeding pair be DNA tested clear or certified clear by parentage of Exercised Induced Collapse (EIC)
- ◆ At least one of the breeding pair be DNA tested clear or certified clear by parentage of Centronuclear Myopathy (CNM)

PSLRA also recommends that its members obtain at least one of the following on their stud dogs and brood bitches before using them in their breeding program:

- ◆ A qualifying score in AKC Obedience, Hunt Test, Agility, or Rally.
- ◆ An AKC tracking title or certification as a Therapy Dog.
- ◆ A Bench Championship point in an AKC licensed dog show.
- ◆ A judges Award of Merit (JAM) or a placement in an AKC licensed field trial.
- ◆ A Retriever Club Working Certificate.
- ◆ The equivalent of any of the above by a recognized American or foreign registry/organization.

PSLRA strongly urges its members to exercise good sportsmanship at all dog related events. PSLRA is a volunteer based club, and thus, rudeness in any form towards any of our volunteers is unacceptable behavior.



LIST OF LITTERS BORN OR EXPECTED AS OF 3/1/2015 that conform to the PSLRA Code of Ethics. Information is as submitted by owners and provided as a service to the public. Listing of litters is in no way an endorsement by PSLRA of any litter or any one litter over another. Litters are removed from the list after 12 weeks.

To publish **LITTER LISTINGS** in the newsletter, the following information **must be available**.

- * Elbows and hips must be permanently certified on both the sire and dam.
- * Current Eye clearances on both parents.
- * At least one of each breeding pair must be tested and certified clear of EIC, CNM and PRA or be shown as CBP. Heart clearances will be included in the listing at the discretion of the breeder.

A PSLRA member must own either the sire or the dam and must submit the listing for a non-member.

Please obtain a Litter Listing form from the PSLRA web site, to be used for ALL litters.

All Breeders must update their litters each week with Nina Mann via email (harbortop@netzero.net) as to the sex and color of puppies you have sold. The listing will be deleted after 12 weeks from the first litter listing date.

1. Mail or email the completed form to Nina Mann, 5706 312th St NW, Stanwood, WA 98292-9649. Please send the \$10 listing fee to Jill Mahoney, Treasurer, by check or PayPal.
2. Your litter notice will appear on the web site and in the next PSLRA newsletter if it conforms to the Code of Ethics.
3. If you know that the Litter Listing and the Puppy Referral programs have helped you sell your puppies, please send a donation to PSLRA (c/o Jill Mahoney, treasurer) to show your appreciation. These donations will all be used for Lab Rescue.

Older Dogs listed do not need to conform to the PSLRA Code of Ethics. Prospective buyers are encouraged to ask about the needs of these dogs and why the breeder/owner has decided to place them. Many of the dogs listed have basic obedience and are housebroken.
