Officer Reports

Secretary: Jan Palumbo read a beautiful thank-you note from Terrie Sato thanking PSLRA for supporting obedience, and in particular, the great new ring gates, the beautiful HIT trial ribbons and the embroidered chair.

Committee Reports

Rescue: Brenda Hubbard shared the Rescue Report prepared by Edith Bryan. Please see elsewhere in the newsletter where the report on Blackie is featured.

Specialty 2014: Cindy Freeman reported there is lots of awards left that can be used for other events.

Health Clinic: Nina Mann requested that people send in their registrations for the Health Clinic as soon as possible so that she can schedule the appointments. Don't worry about checks. All checks will be deposited the day after the clinic, not at the time the registration is sent in.

Fall WC: The Fall WC will be held on September 27, 2014. Angela Rogalla reported volunteers are needed. Entries will be limited to 30 dogs. The Board approved spending \$250 for transporting

the live ducks so that we don't have to ask anyone to house them.

Banquet: The banquet room at the Best Western in Puyallup has been reserved for the Annual Banquet in January.

Old Business

Facebook Ad: The Facebook one-month promo is over. Board felt it was money well spent. Seems not worth it to have the ad run all the time, but running it for one month at selected times would be worthwhile. Might do it for one month before Christmas.

Winger Replacement: The wingers we have will get us through this season. Discussion on hold until after this year's field season.

Trailer: The Board approved selling the old match trailer. An ad for the trailer will be put in the Newsletter.

Judges Selection Committee:

Conformation judges approved last month have all agreed to judge. The Committee is discussing obedience and rally judges.

New Business

Microchips: A question was raised about scanners not reading chips that were placed at the Health Clinic. If a person has this problem they should ask the clinic where the scan failed to update their scanner, as older scanners do not read the Iso chip. If a scan does not work it is because the scanner is out of date.

Club Equipment for Personal Use: If a club member wishes to use equipment owned by the club for personal use they should get permission from the person who is in charge of that equipment for the club. Any equipment that is damaged is expected to be replaced.

Judges Attending the BBQ at the Specialty:

The Board discussed the appearance of impartiality by judges who attend club social functions prior to completion of their assignment. The Board decided that judges should not attend any club functions until they have completed their judging assignment.

Alcohol: The Board decided that PSLRA needs a policy regarding alcohol use by individuals who have driving responsibilities to the club, such as the judges' liaison and those who haul club equipment. A written policy will be

developed. Kimberly Dotson will check with Jan Skewes on club liability coverage.

Enumclaw Show Grounds: Even though PSLRA had a commitment from the liaison from the Enumclaw Expo Center to use the grounds for next year's Specialty, they have given the grounds to another entity. We need to find another place for our 2015 Specialty. Jill Mahoney volunteered to Chair the Specialty, put together a Show Committee, and quickly

find options for where to hold the Specialty. River Bend Park in Mount Vernon was suggested as a possibility. Stand Headwell Park in Chehalis is another possibility. *Support of Sweeps at the Puyallup/Tacoma shows in January:* The Board decided to support Sweeps this year. *PSLRA Ad in LRC National Catalogue:* To get listed for the all-around and versatility awards in the LRC catalogue, the closing date for submittal of the information to Nina is this week. We will have to stick

with this date. But if you got your information to Nina by August 29 you will still get the plaque from PSLRA, but your dog will not be listed in the LRC ad. *Support a Trophy for LRC:* The Board approved donating \$250 to LRC for their Go Green show at the National. Meeting adjourned at 9 p.m. Next Meeting: September 17, 2014, 6:30 p.m. Combined Board/General membership meeting. Please check chat list for location

SUNDAY, SEPTEMBER 28, 2014

By pre-reservation only-closes when limits are reached or **September 17** - whichever is first :

Eye clinic-absolute limit of 100 dogs.

All other tests - no limit

Payment of all fees is required in advance before reservations are confirmed.

A \$5.00 fee will be charged for canceling after paperwork is completed—NO refunds on day of clinic.

REMEMBER: You MUST enclose a copy of each dog's registration papers or litter registration —AND type your entry form!!!!

Eye clinic will be performed by Dr. Sullivan, ACVO, of Animal Eye Clinic of Seattle and is for genetic screening only.

Do not bring dogs with eye injuries or other conditions requiring treatment.

Heart Screening will be performed by Dr. Woodfield, ACVIM (cardiology) of Northwest Cardiology Consultants.

In consideration of confidentiality, please refrain from announcing screen results, either positive or negative while at this clinic.

EIC and CNM swabs and identification verification will be done by veterinarians who have donated their time.



Cranberry

Cranberry, CGC UD BN GN GO VER RE ThD, LRC CC

My yellow Labrador, Cranberry, has been at my side, 24/7, for the last seven and one-half years, working and keeping me safe as my Guide Dog. As she approaches retirement, scheduled for October 2014, I think back on all her accomplishments and the joy she has been to me throughout the years. Her primary responsibility has been that of my Guide Dog. As most of you know, I am legally blind and need her to safely guide me from place to place. However, our 'avocation' has been in the AKC competition rings. Cranberry and I have worked hard and trained together for six years to attain my goal of earning a Utility Dog title.

I have enjoyed training and showing my pet dogs since my pre-teen years and continuing for over 50 years. My pets had titles in Conformation, Obedience, Rally and Agility. When I started losing my vision in 1980, I continued to train and exhibit my dogs, although it became more difficult to see a thrown dumb bell or know exactly when to tell my dog to 'sit' on the Utility go-outs.

When I received Cranberry in April of 2007, I was still competing with my pet dogs. I felt there was no reason I couldn't continue to train my dogs to participate in the events I loved. With the blessings of my supervisor at Guide Dogs for the Blind, Cranberry and I began taking competition obedience classes in October of 2007.

In February 2013, according to my research, Cranberry became the first working Guide Dog to earn the coveted AKC Utility Dog title. She also earned AKC Novice and Open obedience titles, four Optional obedience titles, three Rally titles, the Therapy Dog title and the Canine Good Citizen title. We were encouraged and assisted by our trainer and classmates as well as fellow exhibitors.

In August of 2013, the Olympic Kennel Club honored Cranberry and me for 'outstanding achievement' at their annual show. OKC

conducted a special ceremony, just prior to Best in Show judging, to acknowledge and celebrate our accomplishments. An OKC club representative presented Cranberry and me with a beautiful plaque to recognize the occasion.



Cranberry's last obedience competition was at the Labrador Retriever Club's national specialty in October 2013. I entered her in two classes and Cranberry earned qualifying scores in both. I also entered Cranberry in a class, sanctioned by the Labrador Retriever Club, where she earned her Conformation Certificate, proving her quality as a pure bred Labrador Retriever.

Cranberry's success in the competition ring has prompted other guide dog owners to get involved with competition events. We are encouraging our friends to get out and give it a try. Several have earned their Canine Good Citizen certificate and are well on their way to competing at licensed events. We are looking forward to seeing more working guide dogs enjoying competitions and proud that Cranberry's example has been an encouragement to others.

Cranberry received a 2014 AKC ACE honorable mention in the Service/Guide Dog category. She will be receiving a brass medallion. This is Cranberry's second ACE honorable mention. I'm proud of my girl.

Cranberry has been an amazing dog and one whose memories will be treasured long after she has retired.

I will be graduating with my new pup on November 8 at the Guide Dog campus, 32901 SE Kelso Rd, Boring, Oregon. Graduation starts at 1:30 p.m.. There are tours of the campus after graduation, or if pre-arranged, at 12 noon. Bus groups must pre-register prior to the day of graduation.—Janine Prindle



Rescue Report


BLACKIE

A rescue group in Texas shipped Blackie (approximately 2 years old) to SeaTac airport on her way to a new home in Spokane. After arriving at the baggage terminal, Blackie unfortunately escaped from her crate, bolted in a panic, was seen running down the railroad tracks and spent a scary night roaming the area. Some dog-loving transit workers finally spotted her near the light rail tracks. They coaxed her to their car with treats, and then took her to the nearby transit station. The workers contacted the rescue group in Texas who then called us to see if we could provide a temporary home for Blackie. Blackie was wearing a collar with ID and was also micro chipped - a good reminder for us all that accidents can happen and lots of identification is SO important for any dog!

Brenda Hubbard picked up lovely young Blackie from the transit office, took her home and spoiled her with treats and love.

We found out the original adoptive family was unable to take her, so she was relinquished to our Lab Rescue, partnered with SPDR (Seattle Purebred Dog Rescue). As we have a waiting list right now, we found a family to adopt her.

You've heard of In-N-Out Burgers? Well this was In-N-Out Labrador. In at 10 a.m. on Tuesday and out by 2 p.m. on Wednesday! She went to a wonderful home with a couple and their 6 year old black female Lab, Dixie. They lost their other Lab to cancer 10 days ago. It looks as if we have a banner year for awards! I already have six applications for All-Around recognition and one for Versatility. I know there are many more lurking out there, so please get your paperwork in to me.

As many of you know, we don't close the awards at the end of the year - we close them on the date of advertising closing for the LRC National catalog so we can brag about our accomplished members in that catalog.

This year the closing is on August 29 so I needed to have all the paperwork in before the end of August! If you are new to the club, the requirements for the awards as well as the application are on our PSLRA web site. Please fill it out and send it to me together with copies of your title certificates. You need only send the latest AKC certificate. For example, if you have an AKC championship, an AKC CD, and you get an AKC JH - that last certificate will have the other titles included so only send one piece of paper. If you have an International championship, I know you probably won't have your title certificate as that takes about 8 months or longer to come from Germany. Your cards from the shows are perfectly acceptable.

While you are on our web site printing out the application, take time to look at the list of previous award winners. We are a very accomplished club! I look forward to hearing from many of you!

LIST OF LITTERS BORN OR EXPECTED AS OF 8/29/2014 that conform to the P.S.L.R.A. Code of Ethics.

Information is as submitted by owners and provided as a service to the public. Listings of litters are in no way an endorsement by P.S.L.R.A. of any litter or any one litter over another. Litters are removed from the list after 12 weeks.

To publish **LITTER LISTINGS** in the newsletter, the following information **must be available**:

- * Elbows and hips must be certified on both the sire and dam. Dogs and bitches whelped before 5/1/87 are exempt from elbow clearance requirements and will be marked OFEL N/A. Prelims are not acceptable! The board has agreed to accept PennHip clearances that score in the 50th percentile or higher, and clearances from the Ontario Veterinary College (OVC) in Canada prior to May 2012. Bitches with a Penn Hip, or OVC clearance must not be bred before the age of 20 months, or 24 months with an OFA clearance. Dogs with a Penn Hip clearance must not be bred before the age of 12 months, 18 months with an OVC clearance, 24 months with an OFA clearance.
 - * Eye clearances on both parents annually.
 - * Heart, EIC, PRA and CNM clearances will be included in the listing at the discretion of the breeder
 - * A PSLRA member must own either the sire or the dam and must submit the listing for a non-member.
 - * Please use the PSLRA Breeder Litter Listing Program format below for ALL litters.
 - * All Breeders must update their litters each week with Nina Mann via email (harbortop@netzero.net) as to the sex and color of puppies you have available. The listing will be deleted after 12 weeks from the first litter listing date.
1. Mail the completed form and a check (US funds only) for \$10 (operating expenses for Breeder Listing and Puppy Referral Programs) or email your PayPal receipt to: Nina Mann, 5706 312th St. NW, Stanwood, WA 98292-9649.
 2. Your litter notice will appear in the next PSLRA newsletter if it conforms to the Code of Ethics.
 3. If you know that the Litter Listing and the Puppy Referral programs have helped you sell your puppies, **please send a \$10 donation** to PSLRA (c/o Nina Mann) to show your appreciation. These donations will all be used for Lab Rescue.
