June board meeting minutes

June Board Meeting at Issaquah Fire Station - 1280 NE Park Drive, Issaquah. Attendance included officers and board members: Terrie Sato, Toni Leitao, Ron Perry, Jill Mahoney, Nina Mann, Brenda Hubbard, Gail Gegg, Dave Lawniczak, Sarah Fischer, Mary Jane Sarbaugh. Absent were Nancy Harney, Stephanie Harris, and Shelah Frey.

President's Report: Terrie called the meeting to order at 6:45. Following Shelah Frey's resignation as Treasurer, it was moved, seconded, and approved that Gail Gegg will assume her duties as club treasurer. The slate of Officers is now; Terrie Sato - President, Ron Perry - Vice-President, Gail Gegg - Treasurer, and Nina Mann - Secretary.

Terrie further reported there was a complaint from a puppy buyer that didn't get the puppy he wanted and he wanted his money returned. This was discussed carefully.

Secretary Report: For the record, we noted an earlier Email vote of the Board. The eight members voting approved the increase of \$160 in the specialty hospitality budget. Next, it was moved, seconded, and approval was voted of the General membership meeting minutes from the day of the Match. The only correspondence this month was an AKC letter about the various ways in which event applications can be made. The letter also closed out the spring hunt test officially.

Treasurer's Report: As new treasurer, Gail reported that we have money in the bank, but that she would not be able to give a detailed report until next month. It was then discussed that we should apply for a debit card that would not be used but the possession of which would enable all the officers to access the club account on line.

Acknowledgments: To Jill, Kristi, and MJ for putting on the match and to Rick Mullen, Cindy King, and Jennifer Hajny for judging. Also to Shelah Frey for a good job as treasurer. Match wrap up: The match went off well and the potluck was great. The match lost money because of the small entry caused by all the conflicts on that weekend. MJ suggested changing

the match from June to the night before the specialty, a practice match as so many other clubs put on. Jill asked for the club to buy a new set of rally equipment. This would go in the specialty trailer and the old one would be used for the match. The motion was tabled until Ron looks into the effective dates of the upcoming rally changes.

June Agility trial: Toni will be taking pictures. Jill has parking reservations for 18 trailers. There are some mixed breed entries that will increase our profits.

August Specialty: A meeting of all the heads of committees is planned.

Hunt Test: There was no report on the fall hunt test, but Ron presented a revised copy of the Judges Selection Guidelines with the request that Board members review it and be prepared to vote on it next month. He also is investigating having someone make popper shells for us. He will report on the expense savings.

Christmas party: Brenda asked about decorations. Terrie suggested a ribbon tree as she had seen one that was very effective. Brenda will do a budget for the party.

New Business: It was mentioned that the web site is outdated in a number of areas. It was suggested that we need more than one Webmaster. Toni and Jill offered to help. Jill moved that we spend \$100 on a raffle basket for the Rainier Sporting Dog Specialty. The motion was seconded and approval voted. MJ will put the basket together. Jill said she has filed for an extension on our taxes with the IRS. She can't get all the reports she needs during the transition of Treasurers. The next meeting will be a potluck membership meeting at Nina Mann's house at 6:30 on July 28.



It is a rare opportunity for the Excellent level dogs to run Jumpers with Weaves first. Many people welcomed the chance to get some of the starch out of their dogs before taking on the "hurry up and slow down" which is the challenge of the Standard agility run. We finished the day in twilight looking forward to the next two days of fun.

Saturday and Sunday ran smoothly from the start. We had club members, starting with Terrie Sato bringing special breads for everyone's palette. Donna brought the Starbucks coffee to go with the breads. It went pretty late on Saturday due to inclusion of the FAST class. LIST OF LITTERS BORN OR EXPECTED AS OF 6/25/10 that conform to the PSLRA Code of Ethics. Information is as submitted by owners and provided as a service to the public. Listings of litters are in no way an endorsement by PSLRA of any litter or any one litter over another. Litters are removed from the list after three months.

To publish **LITTER LISTINGS** in the newsletter, the following information **must be available**

- Elbows and hips must be certified on **both the sire and dam**. Dogs and bitches whelped before 5/1/87 are exempt from elbow clearance requirements and will be marked OFEL N/A. Prelims are not acceptable! The board has recently agreed to accept PennHip clearances that score in the 50th percentile or higher, passing Wind-Morgan clearances, and clearances from the Ontario Veterinary College (OVC) in Canada. Female Labradors (bitches) with a Wind-Morgan, Penn Hip, or OVC clearance must not be bred before the age of 20 months, or 24 months with an OFA clearance. Male Labradors (dogs) with a Wind-Morgan, Penn Hip or OVC clearance must not be bred before the age of 12 months, or 24 months with an OFA clearance.
 - Eye clearances on both parents annually. After the dog's examination at age 10, annual examinations are no longer necessary.
 - Heart clearances will be included in the listing at the discretion of the breeder
 - A PSLRA member must own either the sire or the dam and must submit the listing for a non-member.
 - **Please contact Jill if you need a Litter Listing form, to be used for ALL litters.**
 - All Breeders must update their litters each week with Jill Mahoney via email (mahoney@wwdb.org) as to the sex and color of puppies you have sold. The listing will be deleted after three months from the first litter listing date unless she hears from you.
1. Mail the completed form and a check for \$10 (operating expenses for Breeder Listing and Puppy Referral Programs) to **Jill Mahoney, PO Box 7454, Covington WA 98042**.
 2. Your litter notice will appear in the next PSLRA newsletter **if** it conforms to the Code of Ethics.
 3. If you know that the Litter Listing and the Puppy Referral programs have helped you sell your puppies, **please send a donation to PSLRA** (c/o Jill Mahoney) to show your appreciation. These donations will all be used for Lab Rescue.
