April board/membership minutes

April Board and Membership Meeting, was held April 27, 2011, Hilton Garden Hotel, Issaquah. Present were: Ron Perry, Jill Mahoney, Gail Gegg, Nina Mann, Bea Ferguson, Sarah Fischer, Brenda Hubbard, Franna Pitt, Nancy Harney, Mary Jane Sarbaugh, Stephanie Harris. Absent: Terrie Sato. Guests: Joy Weeks, Chris Jaeger

—Ron called the meeting to order at 7:30 and asked for introductions all round.

Secretary: No mail this month, but a phone call from Faye Strauss, all breed judge, Tacoma, wanting to know if we would be interested in holding a judges seminar. She wants to apply for Labradors. (See note under new business.)

Treasurer: Gail reported there is \$16,412.03 in the combined accounts of our CD, Checking, Rescue, and Juniors funds.

Hunting Test: The break-even Spring Hunting Test budget was presented and approved.

Agility: Cheri Levine sent in a budget for the June Agility trial. Ron will ask her about some items that seemed to be high, but the budget showed a nice profit.

Specialty: The chairs asked about raising the second entry fee from \$18 to \$20. This change was approved by vote. Trophies will be pottery, but we have no chair yet for either Donations or the Raffle. It was also moved to offer free entries in Junior Showmanship and this was approved by vote.

Rescue: Brenda reported for Edith the successful placement of the abused Lab who had been chained in the yard and had many ailments. He was adopted by some people who are willing to care for his lifetime skin problems. See Bo's story elsewhere in this newsletter. Jill reported a \$100 donation from Scott and Kendra Norberg in thanks for our help in rescuing Abby.

New committees: Stephanie will put an article in the newsletter about the purpose of the Ethics Review committee. Jill said the Recognition of volunteers committee is still taking in good feedback and she will organize it and report back.

Match: Stephanie and Sarah reported that the June 18 match would be at the Cedar River Park in Renton, which rents for

\$153. There will be competition in Conformation, Sweepstakes, Rally, Obedience, and Junior Showmanship.

New business: The Chesapeake club would like to piggyback on our fall WC and hold their WD test following our WC. They would share in expenses and use our equipment, but issue their own certificates.

—The Master National is considering raising the dues to member clubs from \$50 to \$75 or \$100 annually. They lost \$40,000 on this year's event. Ron wrote them a letter asking for more accountability for the loss. Mike Colson is the nominee from our region to be a judge next year.

—The trophy donation to LRC for the Dog For All Reasons award was approved.

—The judge requesting a judging seminar can't come to our specialty for ringside mentoring as she has an assignment that weekend. Nina will try to get in touch with someone from the Tacoma Judges Study Group to find out if they would add a program on Labradors and what the club would have to do for this program.

—The membership book will be out soon. The next meeting will be May 23 at the Issaquah Hilton Garden hotel.

The Rescue of Bo

Last November we were able to remove a chocolate Lab named Bo from a dreadful situation - he had been tied on a short chain in a yard for several years. His skin had become badly infected with yeast, fungus and bacteria and he had chewed off much of his fur as a result. Poor Bo was in need of immediate medical care and would require a long program of rehabilitation to restore him to good health.

Fortunately, Bo responded well to medication to treat his many infections and - in spite of his poor physical condition - he turned out to have a sweet and friendly disposition. Bo loves everyone he meets and he is great with all other animals. It is a miracle that he survived his ordeal and still thinks people are wonderful!

Bo was in foster care for about six months as he slowly regained his health. Most of Bo's extensive veterinary bills were paid from PSLRA rescue funds. When the time came for Bo to find a permanent new home, we posted his photo and history on the SPDR web site. We had many people who were touched by Bo's story and his soulful look, but most of them backed away after learning that Bo would need lifetime extra care for his skin and coat. But in the end, a wonderful couple adopted Bo and committed to looking after him forever. Bo has settled happily into his new home, and the family has already taken him to dog parks, the beach, and a camping trip in the mountains. Thanks to our rescue funds, Bo was able to have this great second chance in life.



Memories of Memorial Day

It was Sunday, May 24, Memorial Day 2009. Led by our local VFW members, our small town was remembering those people who gave their lives for our freedom. My husband, Jack, director of our community band, stepped up to the podium, raised his arms and prepared to give the downbeat for the first chords of the patriotic medley. On that downbeat, the band started out with the medley. Most people stopped chatting and turned in respect. The ceremony had begun.

After the introduction of some dignitaries and the presentation of the colors, Jack always directs the band in a piece of music that has the songs from each branch of the armed forces in it — *Anchors Aweigh*, *Caisson Song* (now formally known as *The Army Song*), *Marine's Hymn*, etc. During the playing of each piece, Jack calls out the branch of the armed force that each song represents. The service men and women and their families stand up to honor and remember their branch of the service and its members.

I sat, with my Labrador Retriever Guide Dog lying quietly at my feet. On my left, sat my friend with her nine-month-old Guide Dog puppy in training. On my right, a few chairs down the row from where I was sitting with my friend, sat a very elderly gentleman. His doting family was nearby and when his song was played, he struggled to stand up. His family said he was 90 years old and they jumped up to assist him to his feet. He was so anxious and proud to be a part of this celebration and proudly stood and saluted for his branch of the military.

Later, after the program was over and everyone was leaving, this gentleman's family again helped the man to his feet. It surprised me as he turned in my direction and began to shuffle toward me. One of his family members said to me that this gentleman would like to pet my dog. Normally, I don't let people just come up and pet my dog, especially when there is a puppy in training so close that could be petted. However, I couldn't say 'no' to this gentleman. And, as his shaky, gnarly

hands reached for Cranberry, I thanked him for his service and for what he did to keep our country free. As he continued to stroke Cranberry's head, tears began to fill my eyes. We chatted. The longer we chatted, the more the tears fell. I felt overwhelmed with gratitude as the tears continued to roll down my cheeks to the point I could no longer hide them under my sunglasses. It was an emotional ending to this Memorial Day celebration.

The following year, I again was at the Memorial Day ceremony. With my limited vision, I looked for this gentleman. He wasn't there that I could tell. I wondered if this hero was still alive; or, if he had been reunited with his brothers in service.

I hope everyone enjoys their long weekend holiday. Please remember why we celebrate this holiday. Show your appreciation for and remember those heroes who have given their life for what we enjoy today.

Many long time competitors only take their stickers and not their ribbons when they qualify, so we will be donating 50 cents per ribbon to Old Dog Haven when people opt not to keep a ribbon.

We also need volunteers Thursday afternoon for setup and Sunday afternoon around 1 p.m. for take down. It would also be great to have volunteers the other days to show everybody what an active club we are. If you are not familiar with agility trials we will be glad to teach you how to set bars, run leashes, etc. It's a good way




All this combined made it much easier for my co-chair and marshal, Bea Ferguson and myself. Congratulations to all those that qualified!

LIST OF LITTERS BORN OR EXPECTED AS OF 4/28/2011 that conform to the PSLRA Code of Ethics. Information is as submitted by owners and provided as a service to the public. Listings of litters are in no way an endorsement by PSLRA of any litter or any one litter over another. Litters are removed from the list after three months.

To publish **LITTER LISTINGS** in the newsletter, the following information **must be available**

- Elbows and hips must be certified on **both the sire and dam**. Dogs and bitches whelped before 5/1/87 are exempt from elbow clearance requirements and will be marked OFEL N/A. Prelims are not acceptable! The board has recently agreed to accept PennHip clearances that score in the 50th percentile or higher, passing Wind-Morgan clearances, and clearances from the Ontario Veterinary College (OVC) in Canada. Female Labradors (bitches) with a Wind-Morgan, Penn Hip, or OVC clearance must not be bred before the age of 20 months, or 24 months with an OFA clearance. Male Labradors (dogs) with a Wind-Morgan or Penn Hip clearance must not be bred before the age of 12 months, or 18 months with an OVC clearance, or 24 months with an OFA clearance.
 - Eye clearances on both parents annually. After the dog's examination at age 10, annual examinations are no longer necessary.
 - Heart clearances will be included in the listing at the discretion of the breeder
 - A PSLRA member must own either the sire or the dam and must submit the listing for a non-member.
 - **Please contact Jill if you need a Litter Listing form, to be used for ALL litters.**
 - All Breeders must update their litters each week with Jill Mahoney via email (mahoney@wwdb.org) as to the sex and color of puppies you have sold. The listing will be deleted after three months from the first litter listing date unless she hears from you.
1. Mail the completed form and a check for \$10 (operating expenses for Breeder Listing and Puppy Referral Programs) to **Jill Mahoney, PO Box 7454, Covington WA 98042**.
 2. Your litter notice will appear in the next PSLRA newsletter **if** it conforms to the Code of Ethics.
 3. If you know that the Litter Listing and the Puppy Referral programs have helped you sell your puppies, **please send a donation to PSLRA** (c/o Jill Mahoney) to show your appreciation. These donations will all be used for Lab Rescue.
