As you may have heard, our annual specialty, which has been held on Whidbey Island for the last several years, has been on the hunt for a new location. While we have enjoyed our sojourn on Whidbey—and the Island is beautiful—the board and the show committee felt it was time to find a new location, one that was centrally located, beautiful, would fit our needs, and we could afford. Let me tell you this is not an easy order to fill. The specialty site committee headed up by Marlys Swanson has worked long and hard. I sat in on most of the email discussions and they looked at a ton of sites! From north of Mount Vernon to south of Olympia and west to Purdy, state parks, private campgrounds, fairgrounds, private facilities and everything in between were considered.

I'm excited to say that the committee has recommended and the board has approved the new site for next year's specialty. It will be held at the Tolt MacDonald Park and Campground <http://www.metrokc.gov/parks/parks/toltmacdonald.html> in 2008. Everyone who has gone out to see the park has had the same response—It's great! Looks almost perfect for our needs!

This 574 acre King County park is located in Carnation just 20-30 minutes from Monroe, Redmond, Issaquah, or North Bend. For those who will be staying on the grounds, the park has several RV utility hook up sites (water/power) many of which front onto the river, a tent camping section and for those of you who are a little more adventurous both tent and yurt camping across a 500 foot suspension bridge. There is a picturesque former dairy barn where we will be having our banquet and get togethers and lots of additional space should we need it. I was able to swing by and see the site in late August (close to when our specialty is) and everything was gorgeous—Green, manicured, the barn is fabulous.... I can't wait to see the win photos!

Start planning your 2008 specialty right now. Our dates are August 1 and 2, 2008. Please pass the word—I'm sure that with more hotels and easier access our 2008 specialty will be well attended. And with our club it will be a load of fun!

Back to Back Specialties, 2009 and Beyond

With the ever increasing costs for gas, travel, and hotel it has been suggested that PSLRA consider putting on a second back to back "brown bag" specialty. A brown bag specialty is a one day specialty with sweeps and all the classes, but no fancy awards or trophies. So for your traveling money you get twice the chance at points or ribbons or bragging rights and twice the chance at another, usually, breeder judge's opinion about your dog(s).

Clubs around the country are going to a back to back format as exhibitors appreciate the opportunity to compete for two sets of points on one weekend.

It has been suggested that we add Sunday to our specialty dates giving us our normal Friday/Saturday show with a no frills show on Sunday. Personally, I think it's a great idea. Double your chances for the same travel!

August board meeting minutes

The August board meeting was held August 22 at the Bellevue Azteca. Present were: Stephanie Harris, Jill Mahoney, Carole Jensen, Jennifer Hajny, Terrie Sato, Jan Palumbo, Nina Mann, Jessica Meadows, Dave Lawniczak, Becky Jack and Ron Perry. Marlys Swanson was a guest at the meeting.

President's report: No report
Secretary's August report: July minutes were approved by email.

—Jan Palumbo requested and was given board approval to have our rally signs laminated.

Correspondence: AKC notices that our Specialty and Rally events have all been processed and applications for next year's event were sent. The applications will be given to Marlys Swanson, the chair for 2008 Specialty.

—AKC has established a Canine Legislation Support fund, an account devoted solely to canine legislation efforts. Clubs are being encouraged to make donations to that fund.

Treasurer's report: Current balance in checking and savings is \$16,516.44.

—Final report of profit/loss from Specialty is pending until Jill gets the judges' gift expenses from Susie. Jill also needs to determine total number of gift certificates still in inventory. It was M/S/V to reimburse Jill for the overage on the Friday nite get together.

Acknowledgments: Thank you to Stephanie Harris for chairing last month's meeting. Thanks to Sharon Edwards for chairing the Specialty and to Marlys Swanson, her co-chair. Thanks to the cast of many that helped make the Specialty happen and to the membership for once again sponsoring every single class.

Committee Reports: No report from the Budget Committee.

—*Specialty Committee:* The Specialty committee will be holding a wrap up meeting on Aug 30 and will report back to the board.

—*Judges Committee:* Jennifer Hajny reports that her committee has narrowed down their choice of conformation judges to 5-10.

—*Awards Banquet:* No report from chair. Our deadline to get our deposit back from the Muckleshoot is Aug 30. It was M/S/V to go ahead with that location if a viable option is not presented for approval before that deadline. A question was raised about security concerns with dogs in the cars in the parking lot but the Casino has cameras as well as security forces in the parking lot.

—*Fall Hunt Test:* Ron Perry presented a proposal to have food supplied by a caterer, costs would be comparable to what we have spent in the past. A local photographer will be there taking photos.

—*Fall Agility Trial:* Dave reports that the premium is ready to go for our trial to be held November 3 and 4.

—*Specialty Site Committee:* Marlys Swanson reports that the committee has been making an active search for an alternative site for the Specialty. One of the most promising is the Tolt-McDonald campground. It was M/S/V to have Marlys place a deposit to hold the site if it is refundable.

Old Business: A discussion was held as to whether or not adding a second Specialty for 2008 was a good idea. Jill Mahoney asked that we table that discussion until the Specialty committee has made their recommendation.

New Business: It was M/S/V to place an ad in the National catalog that we might have a new Specialty location for next year. It was M/S/V to place our annual PSLRA All-Around Ad in the National catalog.

—There were 11 birds left after the WC so it was M/S/V that Sharon could organize a small WC to use up the birds.

—It was M/S/VB to approve the purchase of new coffee pots for the show trailer and up to four more tables.

—Jill Mahoney offered to host the Xmas party at her house this year.

The board has recently agreed to accept PennHip clearances that score in the 50th percentile or higher, passing Wind-Morgan clearances, and clearances from the Ontario Veterinary College (OVC) in Canada. Female Labradors (bitches) with a Wind-Morgan, Penn Hip, or OVC clearance must not be bred before the age of 20 months, or 24 months with an OFA clearance. Male Labradors (dogs) with a Wind-Morgan, Penn Hip or OVC clearance must not be bred before the age of 12 months, or 24 months with an OFA clearance.
 - Eye clearances on both parents annually. After the dog's examination at age 10, annual examinations are no longer necessary.
 - Heart clearances will be included in the listing at the discretion of the breeder
 - A PSLRA member must own either the sire or the dam and must submit the listing for a non-member.
 - **Please contact Jessica if you need a Litter Listing form, to be used for ALL litters.**
 - All Breeders must update their litters each week with Jessica Meadows via email (labradays@aol.com) as to the sex and color of puppies you have sold. The listing will be deleted after three months from the first litter listing date unless she hears from you.
