PSLRA Board of Directors' Meeting

May 16, 2018

The meeting was called to order at 6:44pm. Officers and directors present included Jill Mahoney, Jen Hajny, Mary Jane Sarbaugh, Kristen Reiter, Stephanie Harris, Nina Mann, Brenda Hubbard, Marcy Johnson, Sonya Dudder, Becky Dannaker, Marlys Swanson, Diane Sullenberger and Shelah Frey. Jill has postponed the survey completion date until May 31st to allow members more time to respond and submit.

Jen has contacted the chairs of our various committees and has not been getting any answers in response to her inquiries for updates.

Kris reports that we have received AKC communications verifying our events.

Mary Jane presented the financial report to the board. A copy can be made available to interested members upon request.

Marlys reported on the Lynden supported entry. Sonya has the prizes. The entry numbers are disappointing and there has been poor email communication by the organizers. Marlys will contact show management to inform them of our difficulties in communication and advise them of our concerns and potential solutions to improve entry numbers. Unfortunately, the timing of the show coincides with shedding season and better known judges could potentially draw more entries.

The organization of the Match is progressing as planned. Mary Jane won't be in attendance, so any requirements of the treasurer must be addressed prior to the event. Marlys will meet with MJ to pick up the prizes. Shelah is going to judge Rally, and the flyers have been updated to reflect that change.

There were no updates from the chairperson on the Spring Agility trial.

There were no updates from the chairs on the Specialty. The lunches are organized and judges' gifts have been purchased. Angela and Katie have scoped out the campsites to determine accommodations for various RV lengths. Some items have been ordered for the raffle and inquiries for donations have been sent. Unfortunately, many of the companies are no longer donating certificates for services/testing as previously offered. It was suggested that Mary Jane contact Drs. Sullivan and Woodfield to determine if they would donate specialty exams as they have in the past.

There was no report on the Fall Hunt Test.

Mary Jane reported on the Health Clinic. Paw Print Genetics will provide their discount. Mary Jane will create a flyer and start distributing it in the July newsletter. There was discussion on opening the Health Clinic to alternative health approaches such as acupuncture or massage. It was decided that the Health Clinic is complicated enough without the addition of other health management opportunities and that treatments such as acupuncture, massage, reiki, etc, would make more sense as offerings for therapy at a competitive event, rather than a genetic screening clinic. If such opportunities will be offered, it was stressed that preference be granted to active club members to participate and offer their services.

The Wenatchee supported entry is progressing as planned. The judges are secured.

There were no updates from the chairperson on the Fall Agility trial.

The Fall Working Certificate is tentatively set for Saturday, September 8th. This falls two weeks after the Fall Hunt Test and will allow us to re-use birds. Jill and Shelah have stepped up to co-chair the event. Participants are encouraged to volunteer to help as well. Shelah will contact Jerry to secure Jerry's Farm (Greenleaf's), Mary Jane volunteered to marshal. Jill will contact Pat Murphy to see if he can care for the live birds between the Hunt Test and the Working Certificate. It was suggested that we ask Diane and Randy Clark if they would be willing to judge.

Brenda provided the Rescue Report. This month's rescue will highlight a chocolate female. The report has already been submitted for the June newsletter.

Mary Jane and Jen volunteered at the Spring Hunt Test. They reported that the tests were well-organized and run, there were no gaps waiting for dogs and the day ran smoothly with the exception of a delay in set-up due to mowing at Pepper's. They had an enjoyable time and will participate again in the future.

Sonya reported on the Annual Banquet. The Ram has a private room we could reserve and be able to order off the menu. The room rental fee is \$25. We could have it catered for \$17-20/person. If we have enough attendees, there would be no charge for the room. The only downfall is that the menu would be limited if we have a very large group and the room size may limit attendance. With no further committee reports to present, old business was addressed.


PSLRA Board of Directors' Meeting

Diane Sullivan will be asked to chair the Junior Scholarship committee. As Marlys has held this position previously, she will serve as her knowledgeable contact and will verify with Diane Sullivan that she is willing to chair the committee. Fundraisers are needed. If the funds are available, we may not have to limit the scholarship to a single applicant, but rather, can award multiple juniors. It was suggested that we recruit the Junior members to help raise money via bake sales or other events. Shelah and Marcy have an idea for fundraising and have volunteered to assume that responsibility again. One item that the committee will need to address is the establishment of a clear selection process and criteria required for application. It was stressed that the scholarships be awarded to active junior members. Simply being the offspring of a club member is not a qualification.

The Judges for 2019 have all been selected and confirmed, with the exception of one individual who has postponed the commitment due to recent life changes. It was suggested that the judging assignment for this individual be postponed to 2020 and the alternate secured for 2019. The judges selection committee provided Jill with the judge next in line to be assigned and Jill will contact that individual.

Jill is working on the Policy and Procedures Committee and could use some help. Interested individuals are encouraged to contact her.



Kris reminded everyone to turn in their newsletter submissions as early as possible due to her upcoming trail ride. Internet connection will be sketchy and she will be in the saddle the last two weeks of May with little time to organize newsletter content prior to the deadline. She will need the updated flyer for the Match, Bios, President's letter, brags, etc, as soon as possible.

Mary Jane just received the new Quick Books software but has not had a chance to install it on her computer. She will need some time to review it to determine if it will work.

The survey deadline has been extended to May 31st. Thus far, there are forty-five responses. There were several comments that members do not feel they are getting anything out of the club. In the past, members were not charged to participate in Field Day and banquets were discounted – members felt they received a value by paying their membership fees. Sixty-four percent of the survey participants were lifetime members. Several people commented that the questions seemed leading for positive responses. There will be more input and discussion at the next board meeting once the survey closes. We may need to call a special meeting to discuss and review the results.

We need to be certain to include acknowledgements for the Hunt Test. Jill will email Cindy Olson to have her provide a list for inclusion in the newsletter.

Discussion progressed to new business. We have been having issues with several non-responsive committee chairpersons. Jen has made multiple attempts prior to the board meetings to contact the non-board committee chairs for updates in planning, budgets, judging assignments, etc, so that she can present the information to the board and provide input back to the chairs regarding board decisions and approval. The Zoom link has been provided to the chairs so that they can participate in our board meetings directly, but several have not taken that opportunity. It was suggested that we start *requiring* all chairs to provide a monthly report to the board.

Another concern is our lack of an official disciplinary committee presiding over events. With some activities, we have enough board members in attendance to fill the duty, but others don't have the same representation and we would have no means of conducting a disciplinary review should one arise. The committee is to be comprised of five members, not necessarily board members, and they are supposed to be listed in the premiums. This topic will need to be revisited as the discussion took a different direction and there was no resolution of this concern.

At this time, we do not know what has been accomplished in the planning for our Fall Agility Trial. Although it is still early in the planning process, the board would still appreciate an update on the event. Jill will reach out to Kristi Clark for a progress report and to inquire if she'd like some assistance in planning. The goal is to have a committee update to present at our next meeting.

There was no further discussion. The next meeting will be held June 20th. The next membership meeting will be June 10th at the Match. The July board meeting will be in person. The meeting was adjourned at 8:01pm.

Getting to Know You—Board Bios!


Mary Jane Sarbaugh







High Scoring Labrador & High Combined x 2!!!




Bravo



Information is as submitted by owners and provided as a service to the public. Listing of litters is in no way an endorsement by PSLRA of any litter or any one litter over another. Litters are removed from the list after 12 weeks. To publish **LITTER LISTINGS** in the newsletter, the following information must be available

- ◆ Elbows and hips must be permanently certified on both the sire and dam.
- ◆ Current Eye clearances on both parents.
- ◆ At least one of each breeding pair must be tested and certified clear of EIC, CNM and RA or be shown as CBP.
- ◆ Heart and other clearances will be included in the listing at the discretion of the breeder.


