Committee Reports:

- Supported Entries –
 - Lynden (May) — Marlys Swanson reported that Saturday would be a major if the dogs hold. Prizes are awesome this year, they are every year. Sweepstakes judge is Mary Jane Sarbaugh. Jessica Baker is doing the ribbons. Marlys is planning on speaking with Lynden's judges selection committee about choosing from the list that we have proved them for the regular classes next year.

- WC – Marlys Swanson reported no update.
- Health clinic - Marlys Swanson reported no update other than reminding membership the clinic is on Sunday, Sept 24.
- National Specialty update – Rob Parkins reported that the committee is looking for a judges liaison. Rob is also Working on finalizing the show budget. Rob and Marcy Johnson are scheduled for Meeting with the Mt.Rainier specialty committee to finalize the remaining National tasks.
- Fall/Spring Agility – No report from Cheri Levine.
- Annual Banquet - Mary Jane Sarbaugh reported no update.

Old Business

- Defibrillator equipment. Nothing new to report per Marcy Johnson
- Litter listing requirements committee brought to the board the recommendations of making heart echo a requirement for both dam and stud dog. They also suggested that if one parent is a carrier for any undesirable trait then both parents must be tested for that trait. One parent must test clear. Marlys Swanson made the above mentioned motion. Sharon Edwards seconded. There were no questions or discussion. Motion passed Unanimous. It was not determined when the change will take affect. Next the committee will review the association's ethic statement.
- Kimberly Dotson forward the committee reviewing the term limits and the maximum number of boards member positions recommendations to the board for review and discussion. Marlys Swanson has some concerns over Event chairs not being represented. Mary Jane Sarbaugh commented on Cindy Olson's comments entailing term limits, number of board and officer members, and nominating procedures. Dogs running in the Benefit can't be entered in the regular show, must be over 10 years old or otherwise considered "senior" for their breed. You must sign up in advance and by the closing date.

Out Standing in the Field: Spring Training Season is Here!

X MARKING DRILL

LEVEL - ALL - This is a fundamental marking drill and can be re-visited throughout a dog's career

PURPOSE - This drill helps develop depth perception. It also instills the idea of marking with your eyes by requiring the dog to either drive through an old fall or, conversely, check-up short of an old fall.

MATERIALS NEEDED - Bird boy and six bumpers - white, black or black and white


PROCEDURE - Bird boy takes the bumpers in the field - the distance away from the dog and handler will depend on the dog's ability. The bird boy will throw each of the following marks as singles:

1. Angle back right
2. Angle in left
3. Angle back left
4. Angle in right
5. Flat left
6. Flat right

The throws should be on alternating sides and at approximately the same distance and angle away from the bird boy.

POTENTIAL PROBLEM	SOLUTION

All marks are run as singles.

The distance from the line to the marks will depend on the terrain and the dog's ability.

Junior Scholarship Recipients



We have two scholarship recipients this year! Ollie Maffett and Cash Hajny. They have grown up in PSLRA together. The picture is of the two of them together as youngsters.

Applicants were asked to write answers to several questions in essay format.

Their essays and photos follow.

Junior Scholarship Recipient — Cash Hajny

As a kid, every time I went to a PSLRA event felt like I was attending a family reunion. I had my family and then I had my dog family, and I always looked forward to the fun we would have. The events that I attended most frequently included the Annual Specialty Shows, the Fun Match, Working Certificate, many supported entries at all-breed shows, the Health Clinic, and the Annual Banquet.

Growing up and attending these events with my mom and grandma, I learned the fine art of being “voluntold.” From dragging pop-up tents and tables around at specialty set-ups to collecting trash in the evenings or filling coolers with water bottles. If something needed to be done and I was close by I would generally get handed a task. As I got older and have not been able to attend as many PSLRA events, I have been able to help “behind the scenes”. For example, when my grandma had the show trailer at our house, I would help her clean and re-organize it. I even washed the outside a few times.

Some of my best memories growing up have been around working with my dogs, getting them ready for events and then competing. Uno was my junior showmanship dog. I called him my “trusty sidekick” because he never let me down. Winning Best Junior Showman at the PSLRA specialty in 2016 was a huge accomplishment and one that I worked hard to earn. Another top memory is when I was seven, I ran my dog Hoyt in the WC. It was my first time at a field event, but my mom told me to trust my dog and what we had practiced. Hoyt earned his WC that day and I was so happy.



I plan to attend Gonzaga University in the fall to study Human Physiology.

My mom often joked that I didn’t need siblings because I had a kennel full of littermates. In fact, you could say I was raised by Labradors.

Ryder was the first. She watched over me as a baby and let me taste her paws and use her as a stabilizer when I was learning to stand. Macy made a great outfielder as I learned how to throw a ball. Flute and I explored the creek and found crawdads. And then there was Hoity-Toity. Hoyt was my best friend and the best listener during my parents’ divorce. I could keep going as the list doesn’t stop there. Over the past 18 years, the Labradors in my life taught me some incredible life lessons.

The first lesson is to greet others cheerfully. My dogs are always happy to see me. Their tails never stop wagging and it’s as if they have smiles on their faces. Showing others that I am happy to see them and being kind improves moods and makes everyone feel good.

Another important lesson is to be there for each other. As I said before my dogs were there for me during some of the toughest moments of my life. I could always rely on them to lick my face and beg for attention to cheer me up. Like my dogs, I can also be there for the people around me, whether it's being a friend to those around me or maybe even helping someone during a rough patch like Hoyt did for me.

Third, be quick to forgive. I have never had a dog hold a grudge or stay mad because I was late feeding him, or I cut a toenail too short. We too should be willing to forget bad feelings when someone offends us. This doesn't mean excusing harm that was done, but sometimes forgiveness is necessary for our own growth.

Last, and maybe most important in their eyes is that **cookies** always help. I learned that if I wanted to show my dogs I cared or reward good behavior giving them a cookie always send the message loud and clear. Plus, cookies just make everything right.

These are just a few of the lessons I will take with me as I move into the next chapter of my life with excitement for what's to come and determination to do my best...just like my dogs!


